

What is our 'Action Plan 2.0'

After a successful completion of Action Plan 1.0 and the subsequent research visits to camps in the most dire conditions, we have done another analysis of key barriers to social, economic integration and created a new plan of action to empower the refugees.



Action Plan 1.0 saw the RAP team execute over 9 initiatives which supported the plight of 60,000 refugees in India who were unknown to refugee activists and humanitarians until the research report was released by our Director General Kiran Chukkapalli on 2 May 2021. These refugees have suffered in silence for years, and Action Plan 2.0 looks to further support these refugees and bring them out of this silent refugee crisis.

What is the 'silent' refugee crisis?

The refugee crisis in today's world is a complex humanitarian emergency of enormous proportions and impact. Despite global media's increasing coverage of refugee matters, within the Indian subcontinent there remains refugee communities, mainly concentrated in India who have received very little attention and need urgent help. These "silent" refugees are victims of forced poverty, homelessness and lack legal status. They have fled their homes in search of a safe home to live, learn and prosper.

The Refugee Aid Project (RAP) mission is a humanitarian effort to uphold universal human rights and ensure dignity, safety, and justice for silent refugees who have been displaced due to war, conflict or religious persecution in neighbouring countries, and seek refuge in the Indian subcontinent.

What is happening in the neighbouring countries of India?

The Indian refugee crisis began with India and Pakistan's Independence in 1947 and is ongoing. In more than seven decades, India has seen a continuous influx of refugees fleeing conflict from her neighboring nations and seeking refuge in India. Major refugee crises since the 1947 partition includes Dalai Lama's political asylum, Bangladesh war, Sri Lankan civil war, Soviet-Afghan war, and Myanmar's Rohingya genocide, these have been widely reported, prompting community and government assistance. However, little is known of the continuous migration of thousands of refugees every year, owing to religious and ethnic persecution in neighboring countries, mainly Pakistan and Bangladesh. Affected minorities in those countries live a life of fear and humiliation, with women and children facing a major share of the violence. Today, millions of such silent refugees who have had to flee persecution in Pakistan, Bangladesh, Afghanistan, Sri Lanka, and Myanmar are living in scattered camps and other settings all over India.

What is our objective?

With a continuous rise in the number of refugees in cities, towns and villages across India, there is an immediate need to deal with their reception and integration into society. RAP will deliver socio-economic programs to help refugees build a life of dignity in India. RAP will also work to raise awareness of the silent refugee crisis and call on stakeholders and policy makers to come to refugee's aid. In summary, our primary goal is to ensure that no one, no group, no government, can take away the basic human right of an individual to live with dignity, freedom, equality, justice, and peace.






